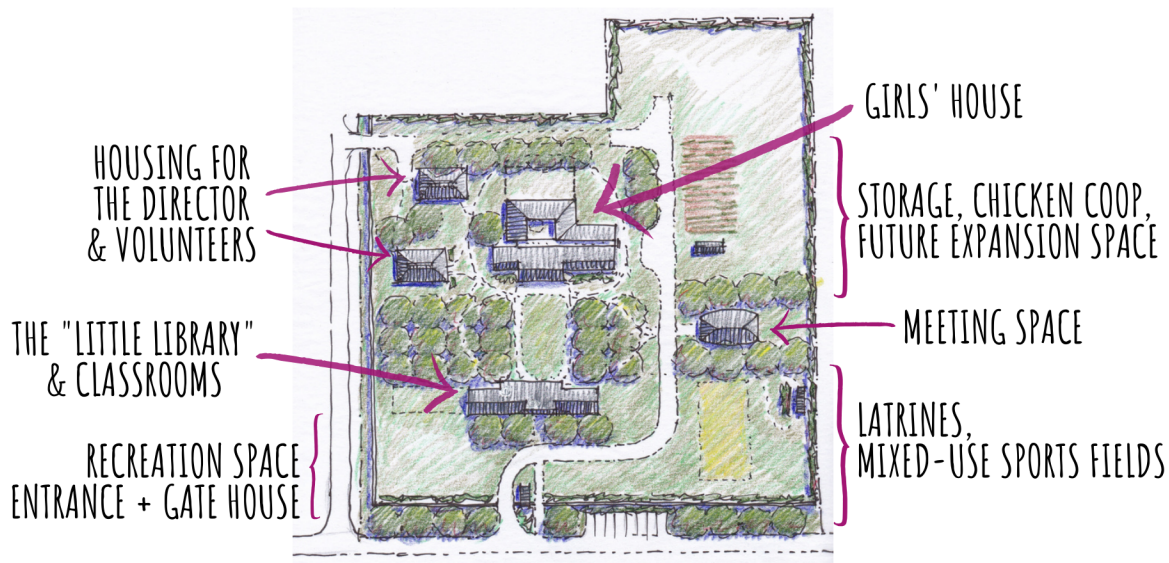
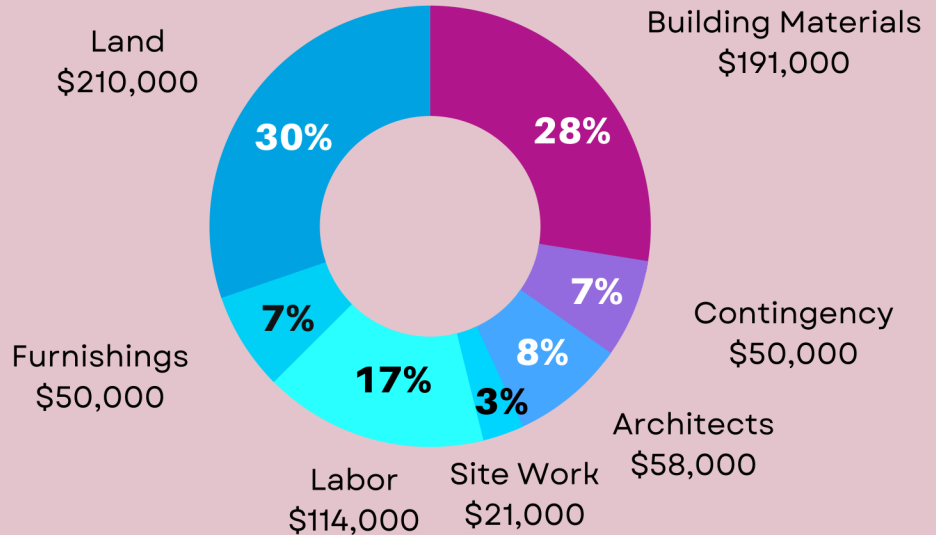

Budget Notes:

- **Land:** we have contracted to purchase 4 acres of land in Arusha
- **Materials:** includes the security wall; housing for the girls, director, and volunteers; classrooms; library; meeting places; latrines; and a guard's room
- **Labor:** construction may take up to 16 months; labor includes the construction crew, guards, foremen, and managers
